## Waiting List Policy

Victory Christian Academy High School seeks to admit all students who are capable of being successful within the program it provides as defined in the Mission Statement and Statement of Goals. When a waiting list for acceptance is maintained, the following priorities will be observed:

1. Families who already have a student enrolled
2. Families who are members of a supporting (Association) congregation
3. Families who are members of a non-Association Lutheran congregation
4. Non-Lutheran families who are active members of a non-Lutheran, Christian church
5. Families with no active church affiliation

In order to be considered on the waiting list, the enrollment fee, application form and Pastor's recommendation form must be received in the school office.

\*International Students must pay a deposit of \$2,700.00 before we issue I-20. Balance due upon start of semester. No discounts apply. Registration / Re-enrollment Fee is non-refundable. If student's Visa is denied, we will refund Tuition and Book Fee upon presentation of denial letter (with official seal) from immigration. International Service Fee is non-refundable if student is not withdrawn 30 days prior to semester start.

Note: Association churches are those which are committed to support the school with a portion of the costs. The **actual cost of education** for each student at VICTORY is approximately \$15,000 per year.

#### Registration Fee for New Domestic Students:

Through January 31: \$150.00 Beginning February 1: \$250.00

#### Registration Fee for Returning Domestic Students:

Through February 28: \$150.00 Beginning March 1: \$250.00

**International Registration/Re-enrollment:** \$300.00

**International Service Fee** (Misc. Fees for Yr., Due in May) \$650.00  
Non-Refundable if Student is not withdrawn 30 days prior to Start of Semester

At the time registration forms are submitted for the following school year, a non-refundable enrollment fee is paid, which covers the setting up of records, the processing of programs, testing, and applications. In addition this fee includes costs for grade reports, student ID cards, and admission to specified school events. The order in which this fee is received sets the order in which students can select their classes for the following year.

**Book & Equipment Fee** (Payable in June) \$550.00

**Returning Students Renting VICTORY iPad add \$75.00**

Fee includes the rental of textbooks, lab sups., ASB dues, yearbook, & earthquake sups.

**Note: All New Students must supply their own iPad**

**Graduation Fee** (Payable in September-Domestic Seniors only) \$75.00

## Payment Schedules

Three payment schedules are available. Parents select their method of payment at the time of registration each year.

### Plan 1: Annual (1 payment)

Full payment of yearly tuition and fees is payable on or before July 1. A \$100 discount of base tuition is given if payment is made on or before July 1.

### Plan 2: Semester (2 equal payments)

Tuition is paid twice a year, along with applicable fees. The two payments are due July 1 and December 1. A \$50 late fee will apply after July 8 and December 8. The Thrivent Simply Giving tuition payment plan form must be completed but will not be processed unless the 2nd payment is delinquent.

### Plan 3: Monthly (11 equal payments)

Tuition is paid through the Thrivent Simply Giving tuition plan via electronic transfer on the date of the month selected, beginning with July and ending with May. A \$20.00 a month late fee will apply to all past due payments.

## Board Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees for each semester are to be paid in accord with the terms of the plans in the Financial Responsibility Agreement. In no case will students with delinquent accounts be allowed to sit for final exams, or be eligible for diplomas or report cards unless financial responsibilities have been met prior to May 31 of each school year.

Discounts apply to tuition only. **No discount shall total more than 50% of the tuition for the year involved.**

## Scholarships, Grants and Financial Aid

### Academic Excellence Scholarships

\$2000 awards for Lutheran Elementary School valedictorians; \$1000 for salutatorians. Renewable annually-based on academic performance.

### Great Expectations Award

\$1000 awards for the outstanding 7th grade student in a Lutheran School; selected by the school Principal and Faculty; designated June 1.

### Enrollment Sponsorship Award

A current student family who sponsors/recruits a family new to VICTORY earns an award of \$300 to be applied to their tuition account; some restrictions and conditions apply.

### Grants-in-Aid

A limited amount of Grant-in-Aid financial assistance is available to worthy students in families with demonstrated financial need. Victory High wants to make this educational opportunity available to as many students as possible.

Applications for financial aid (available from the VICTORY office) need to be in by April 30 to be considered. Criteria of both need and merit are employed in making awards. Considerations include church attendance and participation in church life, family income, number of children enrolled in Lutheran schools from the same family, unusual medical expenses, Christian character, academic promise and previous academic performance. A signed copy of Form 1040 is used to verify income. An outside evaluator of need may be used and a processing fee will apply.

### Additional Financial Resources

Student families are encouraged to pursue other resources for obtaining financial assistance, including church and elementary school scholarships, gifts from family and friends, part-time jobs, and other sponsors.
